Gilbert and Janine Durand were in attendance in support of their application and to answer questions.

Daniel Burns, NE ½ 2-8-19 WPM, appeared in opposition to the application. He indicated he did not believe the proposed location was a fit with the surrounding area and did not meet the three test requirements set out in The Planning Act, the Development Plan and the Zoning By-law. He noted the surrounding area was large holdings for agricultural purposes. Redesignation of the area would be likely to result in conflicts between existing agricultural operations and new residential parcels. A copy of his presentation was being sent to the office to be placed on file.

Murray Kozak, S ½ 2-8-19 WPM, appeared in opposition to the application as he has a cattle operation with between 75 to 100 animals and has concerns with respect to water supply and the potential for conflict with a residential development.

Jason Flikweert, owner of 2 & 10 Metal Recycling in SE ½ 2-8-19 WPM, appeared before Council appeared in opposition to the application with respect to the density being proposed.

Sharla Dillabough, Regional Planner with Community and Regional Planning, appeared before Council to review her written report and comments provided by other government agencies.
